The Trashing Epidemic 9th June

Volunteers of the Society participated in the garbage collection drive in two of our Heritage Rock sites: Moula Ali on 31.32024 and Fakhruddingutta (Khajaguda Rocks) on 9.62024. I am really happy that more and more people are visiting our gorgeous rocky hill of Fakhruddingutta to enjoy nature, but the pitiable condition of this beautiful site which is inundated with plastic bottles, plastic bags,—

-shards of hundreds of beer bottles, and all kinds of rubbish, is heart-rending as well as deeply frustrating. After collecting 74 (!) big garbage bags of trash from this favourite Hill of ours recently, we have to admit that the hard work of the 50 odd volunteers from many groups (organized by the Waste Project and joined by our Society, the Eastman Company, the Hyderabad Cycling Revolution a.o.) could only clear a fraction of the hill from this invasion. Can't we even keep our rocky hills from becoming garbage heaps like our whole city threatens to become?

How do we drill the "Don't litter" command into citizens' heads and make them feel concern for their surroundings and the environment? Isn't it everyone's responsibility? Even putting up big garbage bins might not help because these will be destroyed by the hooligans who seem so omnipresent in our society today. Did you say "Why should I sacrifice my Sunday morning to clear up other people's trash?" You are right – and yet, for the sake of our environment, for the beauty of our rocky landscape and healthy lung spaces in and around our city: Come and help. And be ready to put up "plogging" programmes during your outings and excursions, as we will do now during Rock Walks! – F.Q




